

# **INFORMATION PACK/LOGISTICS NOTE**

FOR DELEGATES TO THE EXTRA-ORDINARY MEETING OF THE BUREAU OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL OF PARTIES TO THE LUSAKA AGREEMENT

 $15^{\text{TH}} - 17^{\text{TH}}$  MARCH 2017 LAICO REGENCY HOTEL - NAIROBI, KENYA

### 1. INTRODUCTION

The Extraordinary Meeting of the Bureau of the Governing Council of Parties to the Lusaka Agreement will be held from 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> March 2017 at the Laico Regency Hotel located at the Central Business District in Nairobi, Kenya. The meeting is being organized by the Lusaka Agreement Task Force (LATF), the Secretariat to the Lusaka Agreement on Cooperative Enforcement Operations Directed at Illegal Trade in Wild Fauna and Flora.

The Meeting will bring together Ministers, other senior Ministry Officials and Heads of National Bureaus/Technical Experts who are preferably Heads/Directors of Wildlife Authorities from all Member states directly involved in the implementation of the Agreement. Owing to the importance of the substantive matters to be discussed at the meeting, invitations have been extended to all Lusaka Agreement member states namely Congo, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia. The Ministers or their alternates/designates will be the Heads of Delegations.

The Ministerial Session to be held on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2017 will be preceded by a two-day experts meeting. In this respect, Heads of National Bureaus and/or Technical experts are expected to travel to Nairobi on 14<sup>th</sup> March 2017 while the Bureau officials and other Members of Governing Council (Ministers) will travel to Nairobi on the eve of the Ministerial Session on Thursday, 16<sup>th</sup> March 2017. All delegates will depart a day after the meeting on Saturday, 18<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

The meeting will among other things:

- i. Elect Bureau Officials of the  $11^{th}$  Governing Council, in accordance with Decision XI/7(2) of the Meeting of the Governing Council held on  $3^{rd}$  May 2015 in Brazzaville, Congo;
- ii. Review and make substantive decisions on LATF progress reports for the financial years ending 30th June 2015 and  $30^{th}$  June 2016;
- iii. Deliberate and make concrete decisions on the Financial position of LATF;
- iv. Review LATF and Party proposals;
- v. Consider and adopt LATF Programmes of Work and Budgets for Financial years 2016/2017 and 2017/2018.

The meeting's provisional agenda has been shared with all member states. We will be sending other documents in due course and keep you informed of the progress on the Meeting's arrangements.

2. TIME ZONE

Kenya is GMT + 0300 hours

3. **VISAS** 

It is the delegate's own responsibility to obtain a visa for Kenya. The information provided

herein acts only as guidance. A valid passport, not expiring for at least six months from date of

arrival is required for entry into Kenya. A valid entry visa is also required for most countries

and may be obtained in advance from the Kenyan Embassy/High Commission in your country

of residence. In the absence of either, the British Embassy will generally represent Kenya in

4. **HEALTH** 

It is a requirement that you must have a valid international certificate of vaccination for Yellow

Fever to gain entry into Kenya. Malaria risk exists throughout the year in Kenya; though there is

little risk in Nairobi and the highlands, therefore it is advised that you take precautions while

travelling out of these areas. A delegate shall bear any medical and related costs incurred during

his/her stay in Kenya; it is therefore strongly recommended that delegates arrange for their own

health insurance before travelling.

The meeting hotel (venue) has an in-house clinic which attends to emergencies before specialized

treatment is sought.

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Kenya has temporarily lifted restrictions to travelers from previously Ebola stricken countries. However, visitors entering Kenya may still be required to undergo screening upon arrival at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport, Nairobi.

#### 5. TRAVEL

As earlier communicated, participants are required to make their own travel arrangements to and from Nairobi, including airport transfers as well as local transport within Nairobi.

#### 6. HOTEL ACCOMODATION

Participants are advised to arrange for own accommodation and may wish to consider staying at any of the hotels provided in the list annexed. LATF has corporate rate arrangement with Laico Regency Hotel (the meeting venue) and made tentative booking for a number of rooms for willing delegates. It is advisable that at least heads of delegations' (Ministers) are accommodated at Laico Regency Hotel.

#### 7. CONFERENCING

All delegates will be provided with the meeting materials. They are also entitled to lunch, refreshment, morning and afternoon tea/coffee during the conference.

#### 8. WEATHER

Nairobi experiences a pleasant tropical climate. In the month of March it is generally expected to be cloudy/wet with temperatures ranging between  $23^{\circ}$ C to a high of  $28^{\circ}$ C. It may be cold in the evenings with temperatures dropping to about  $14^{\circ}$ C and participants are advised to carry warm clothing. Participants may wish to confirm the weather in Nairobi immediately before travelling to enable them chose appropriate clothing.

#### 9. MONEY AND BANKING

### **Currency and exchange rates**

The official currency of the Republic of Kenya is the Kenya Shilling (KES). The current exchange (average) rates are: 1 US Dollar = KES 102.00; 1 EUR = KES 110.00

Foreign currency can be converted at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport, banks, foreign currency Exchange Bureaus or hotels. Banks in major centres are open from 09:00 to 16:00hrs on Monday to

Friday and from 09:00 to 12:00hrs on Saturdays.

There may, however, be limitations in conversion of certain currencies and it is advisable to carry USD, Sterling Pounds, Euros, South African Rand or Kenya Shillings. Please note that often small denomination bills receive a lower exchange rate.

#### **Credit Cards**

Major international visa/credit cards such as VISA, MasterCard, Diners Club and American Express are accepted at some supply stores, shops, restaurants and places of entertainment, as well as in ATM machines. Credit card fraud occurs in Kenya as in most other parts of the world. The usual precautions should therefore be taken.

#### **ATMs**

ATMs are available country wide with 24-hour access. Within close proximity of the venue and the hotels listed, the following ATMs are available: Barclays Plaza along Loita street and Standard Chartered Bank along Koinange street.

#### Travelers' cheques

Travelers' cheques are accepted at most banks, foreign currency exchange bureaus, hotels and stores in major shopping malls.

Tipping is appreciated; however, most hotels and restaurants do include a service charge.

#### 10. ELECTRICITY

Electricity service in Nairobi is 220-240 Volts, 50 Hertz AC. Kindly note that Kenya uses the 13A 3 pin wall switch socket outlet. Participants are advised to check the voltage before using appliances and where necessary carry with them converters or adapters.

#### 11. Wi-Fi

Free Wi-Fi facility will be available in conference/meeting room. You will be guided on the specific user name(s) and password(s).

12. **SECURITY** 

There are no specific security concerns. Kenyans are generally friendly/hospitable people.

However participants should pay attention to the following when touring the Nairobi city:

Keep to the main roads/streets and avoid short cuts, dark alleys or isolated places;

Always take a taxi when it's late at night;

Be particularly wary of people hanging around outside hotels; some may be criminals

lurking around in search of vulnerable visitors/tourists;

• Ignore street children and people coming to you with hard luck tales. Street children can

become a nuisance, violent and may be part of an elaborate scam or they might just be

pick pockets. The best thing to do is just walk on and ignore them;

Do not carry large sums of money when shopping and do not wear expensive jewelry. It is

advisable to keep valuables in the hotel safe;

Beware of credit card fraud as it is common in most large cities. Try and ensure that credit

card slips are endorsed in your presence and if you have to have a slip as a deposit,

always fill the amount in and ensure that you get the slip back.

• Do not accept food and drinks from strangers. Visitors have been known to be drugged

and then robbed. Exercise caution when talking to strangers.

Be conscious of what is happening around you on the street. Radiate confidence and act as

if you belong here and know where you are going.
